## Our Trust Year

The West End Schools' Trust (WEST) is a charitable company of eight primary schools and partner organisations located in the inner west of the city of Newcastle upon Tyne. The schools included in the Trust are: Bridgewater; Broadwood Primary School; Canning Street Primary; Hawthorn Primary School; Moorside; St John's Primary School; St Paul's Primary School and Wingrove Primary School.

Our Trust was formed in January 2015. We are responsible for the education of nearly three thousand pupils and employ almost three hundred teachers, teaching assistants and administrative staff.

When pupils leave our schools they are well prepared for the next phase of their educational journey. All of the schools are unique and although they may vary in size and context, Ofsted inspections for the cluster reveal effective schools that work in collaboration for the benefit of the whole of the community.

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### Teacher Development Fund

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We entered our second year of partnership with Tyne & Wear Archives and Museums (TWAM).

The Teacher Development Fund from Paul Hamlyn Foundation supports teachers to work with local arts and cultural resources to increase learning opportunities for pupils.

Teachers from WEST schools together with Hadrian Primary in South Shields and Western Primary in Wallsend have been supported by museum staff and artists to draw on inspiration from museum collections in order to support pupil's speech and language development through enquiry based learning approaches.

### Network meetings and training

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Our staff across the Trust regularly meet to share ideas and training and run Trust wide projects.

## Message from the Chair

In a general crisis such as coronavirus, the way institutions react must be both individual and coordinated. ## Children's Community

Our community is very important to us. We are part of the West End Children's Community working together with key partners to support the area where our children live and attend school. This year we have benefitted from support from an expert in play, Jackie Boldon from Sussed and Able. She has worked with our children to explore play and undertaken an audit of play. Play is very important to children for their health, regulating feelings and to help them learn. The pandemic has disrupted the play strategy we had but we still achieved an audit of literature and secured funds to deliver some lamp post play resources and opportunity for conversations as part of the Summer of Change summer programme.

### STEPS

With thanks to Sandra English, her colleagues at Reviving the Heart of the West End and funding from Your Homes Newcastle we were able to support some parents who felt that they needed a course to boost their confidence and self esteem. The course was also an opportunity to provide advice in elevating concerns such as social isolation and housing. It was incredibly beneficial to participants.

We extended the course to support some pupils too. On the whole we supported those pupils of the family member who had completed the STEPS course. They undertook some strategies to keep a calm state with Sens8tional CIC, did some Metafit with Positive Energy North East and finally as a family completed a journal of "The Story of you and me" with artist, Amy Lord and her team.
